Stuart H. Smith passed away on March 26, 2010. He was the 6th of seven children, born on May 1, 1922 to Ellen and Ray Smith of Northern Idaho. Stuart attended the U of W where he received a Masters and distinguished himself in football. He went on to teach and coach at the Edmond's School District later to become an administrator there before retiring in the mid-70s.

He went into the officers training program in the Marines, receiving his commission in the U.S. Navy. Stuart served as a Navy Frogman in the U.D.T. on the ship Waukesha and led his men into Nagasaki hours after the atom bomb was dropped. He is survived by his wife, Gail; his son, David Bennett; two daughters, Sydney Zvara and Heidi Smith; and four grandchildren.
